<p>BA Sociology consists of 36 credits of core courses and 9 credits of upper division elective courses to fulfill the 45 credit requirement for the program.</p> <p>Students may choose the elective credits from the following areas of study:</p> <p>Communications (COMU), Criminal Justice (CJCU), Environmental Sciences (ESCU), History (HISU), Legal Studies (LEST), Marketing (MKTU), Organizational Leadership (OLCU), Political Science (POSU), Social Science (SSCU), Social Work (SOWK), Sociology (SOCU) or LBSU 492 (Experiential Learning)</p> <p>It is possible for transfer courses to meet course requirements within the emphasis area. That coursework must be reviewed by a dean within the School of Arts and Sciences to determine transferability.</p>
